- AY 2025 Sponsorship 125 officers from 97 countries
- Flexibility is key

 - IMSD has country information only
- Lottery process used for Class of 2025 assignments
 - Sponsors were asked to provide 12 choices in ranked order
 - Sponsor flexibility is crucial to completing assignments
 - Sponsors will be notified of their country/officer assignment shortly after the May 10 lottery

Timeline & Officer/Sponsor Interaction

- All IMS will report on June 17, 2024 and start in-processing
- IMS can move on post if housing is available or take ownership off post if they have pre-coordinated
- IMSD will do airport pickups
 - Sponsors may greet their IMS at the airport, please communicate intention to IMSD reps providing transport
 - Sponsors may pick up their IMS if they pre-coordinate with IMSD Deputy Director Adam Escondido
- In-person sponsor icebreakers June 27, 28, July 1 & 2 at the Frontier Conference Center (FCC), 18:00-21:00
 - June 27 Albania-Ecuador
 - June 28 Egypt-Kuwait
 - July 1 Kyrgyzstan-Philippines
 - July 2 Poland-Vietnam
- "Pace" of the course (starting with Aug 5 Flag Ceremony) will be more intense between through Winter break, expecting 6-8 hours daily. After Winter break, the schedule will be less intense.





- Submit applications to GKCPTP (Pat and Sharon) in December
- All LAC applications are due no later than Jan 4
- IMSD (Robert Tapia) will submit to Mr. Fain for approval on Feb 1
- IMSD will notify GKCPTP (Pat and Sharon) when apps are ready for pickup
- Sponsors have 30 days to pick up their pass
- LAC pass expiration date will be Feb 28, regardless of submittal date or pickup date



- LAC applications are being accepted (primarily for new sponsors, any current sponsors can submit)
- LAC instructions are on GKCPTP's website
- Visitor Control Center (VCC) is operational Mon-Fri, 7:00 – 4:00
- Valid LACs will not be denied installation access, but please evaluate the requirement
- Visits between IMS and Sponsors are encouraged based on individual requirements



Virtual passes are available online

Things to know

- Sponsor may request a temporary pass valid for 1 up to 10 days
- Pass may be submitted no earlier than up to 10 days in advance
- A "virtual pass" will be attached to the visitor's ID in the security scanning system



How to get a Temporary Virtual Pass to Fort

- To apply, go to this link <u>Visitor Pre-Registration Site</u> and follow the instructions
- Please have DL (driver's license) and SS (social security) information on hand and then proceed. Each sponsor must fill out his or her own application form.
- Once the virtual application is complete it will automatically be available to the security personnel at the gate. No need to pick up a physical pass for this temporary 1-10 day option.
